The system features a modular and scalable architecture that allows customers to pick from departmental and enterprise-wide, up to regional sharing deployments, providing an IHE-XDS and XDS-I compliant repository. Its multimedia archive capabilities support data formats including JPEG,

avi or PDF, extending existing Picture Archiving and Communications Systems (PACS) such as syngo.plaza.
